


One-Line Header with Logo Aligned to the Left




4. Mega Menu Header

6. Header with Utility Bar This header adds extra features above


the main menu at the top of the page. It's usually a small bar where you can put things like contact info or social media links. This keeps important details easy to find without distracting users from the website's main design.
